SLFC Catch-Ups

Often, the best ideas come from churches. That's why, in July last year, we held our first Catch-Up session for SLFCs on Zoom. We've held one once a month since then and it's been a privilege to see a mixture of new and familiar faces in attendance.

Participants have greatly valued the opportunity to talk directly to others working tirelessly to include people with sight loss in their local churches.

The monthly catch-ups have been really valuable in engaging with people from other churches around the UK, sharing ideas about worship in lockdown as well as learning about initiatives to help those with sight loss deal with COVID-19 measures.

Sessions last around half an hour and generally take place at 7:00 pm on a Tuesday or Thursday. There's usually a short update or story from Torch, with plenty of time for people to ask questions or share advice.

- Guiding people with sight loss in a COVID-secure way
- Experiences of people with sight loss participating in church during lockdown and their return to church

We are working hard on content for 2021 and hope to cover:

- How Accessible Christian Literature is produced
- The support we can offer directly to blind and partially sighted people
- Braille and large print introduction

The New International Reader's Version (NIrV) is a translation of the Bible which, through the use of simpler language and shorter sentences, is designed to be more accessible to children and people who have difficulty reading English. It was fully revised in 2014 and, thanks to a partnership with Biblica (formerly the International Bible Society), Torch has recently transcribed this version in large print.
